This early Ford comes from a homestead on the banks of the Salmon River in Connecticut. It was found in a field behind a barn, where it had been repurposed for plowing and harrowing—a job it could handle thanks to the unique design of its transmission system.

Today, after a **thorough restoration**, this Model T is not only a **jewel in our museum's crown**, but also a **regular showstopper** at vintage car events.

The **Ford Model T**, often credited with “**putting America on wheels**,” began production on **October 1, 1908**, and continued until the arrival of the Model A on **May 26, 1927**. It became a **symbol of progress and innovation** in the early 20th century.

The model on display is **far from ordinary**. It features a **custom transmission and suspension setup**, a **lightweight body**, and an **engine modified for better compression**—all upgrades that made it more capable in its working days, and more impressive today.

A **true working classic**, reborn as a **proud piece of automotive history**
