

Studebaker 1925

From Tennessee with style.

This stately blue Studebaker comes from Loudon, Tennessee, and was once part of a classic car collection owned by a man who—believe it or not—knew exactly where České Budějovice is! His son, a police officer in nearby Knoxville, used the car for weekend drives.

The model you see here was one of Studebaker's most popular at the time. It's a smaller successor to the 1922 Special SIX, which you can also find elsewhere in our museum.

And what a difference just three years made. Compared to the more carriage-like construction of earlier models, this 1925 version features a more rounded, compact, and—by 1920s standards—modern body design.

By the mid-1920s, Studebaker had shaken off its wagon-making past and built a strong reputation as a producer of modern, stylish automobiles. The SIX you see here is living proof. Its elegant lines and confident stance made it a symbol of change.
