

Ford A 1929

This charming 1929 Ford Model A comes to us from Albertville, Quebec, Canada. Its previous owner served on the local town council, but it was his wife who drove the car most often. Her reason?

"It was easy to get out of," she said with a smile.

The Model A was Ford's much-anticipated successor to the legendary Model T—the car that had "put America on wheels." But the Model A wasn't just a follow-up—it introduced a series of important innovations: it was the first Ford with safety glass and standard gear shifting.

Production lasted from 1927 to 1931, ending with the Model B. In total, over 4.8 million Model A cars and trucks were built in a wide variety of styles.

The version you see here is the Coupe, often affectionately called the "Doctor's Coupe"—one of the most elegant and popular body styles of its time, second only to the convertible.

We acquired this car pre-restoration and spent three years lovingly bringing it back to life. It now runs smoothly, is fully roadworthy, and proudly certified as a classic vehicle.
