The car is part of Cadillac's legendary Series 62, produced from 1940 to 1964, when it was eventually renamed Calais. Compared to its 1957 predecessor, the 1958 model introduced dual headlamps, a reworked grille, and a few refined touches—all aimed at keeping Cadillac at the top of its game.

Cadillac has long stood for prestige, luxury, and presence, especially in its two-door coupe models like the Eldorado Biarritz, Brougham, or Seville. The Series 62 Coupe, along with the Coupe de Ville, was made for those who wanted both style and strength. Today, original Cadillac coupes are harder and harder to find—and even tougher to import. That makes this car a rare treasure, and we're proud to have it. It's currently scheduled for restoration, and we look forward to the day it shines again in its full 1950s glory.
