

Ford Gran Torino 1972

Detroit muscle meets Hollywood flair.

This sleek machine comes from Wayne, New Jersey, where it was owned by the manager of a local golf club—someone with a clear eye for style and performance.

Under the hood, you'll find a Cleveland V8—named after the Ohio factory where these engines were built until 2012. It's a motor with legacy, punch, and a sound that turns heads.

Design-wise, this Torino showcases the famous “Coke bottle” styling. Imagine the silhouette of a glass Coca-Cola bottle: wide at the fenders, narrow at the waist, curvy and aggressive—that’s exactly what the designers aimed for. The 1972 model saw a major redesign: a bold hood scoop, longer front, and the cabin shifted rearward for a dramatic fastback profile. You might recognize it from the 2008 movie *Gran Torino*, directed and starring Clint Eastwood. He liked the car so much during filming that he bought it from the production team once the final scene wrapped.

Back then, the Torino was one of Ford’s most popular models—and with this level of style and power, it’s not hard to see why.
