

## Hupmobile Model R – 1918 Convertible

This 1918 Hupmobile Model R is a true treasure. Originally purchased by a grandfather, inherited by his son, and eventually sold to us by the grandson—it's a family legacy on wheels.

And it still runs beautifully. Smooth, reliable, and full of charm, it's one of those finds that make our late-night chats with U.S. collector friends worth it. We're thrilled to share it with you.

This car belongs to the first generation of Model R, produced between 1917 and 1925. The company behind it—Hupp Motor Car Company of Detroit—was founded in 1908 by Robert and Louis Hupp. Robert had previously worked at Oldsmobile, Ford, and Regal, bringing a wealth of experience.

A year before this model's debut, the earlier Hupmobile Type N undertook a legendary journey to all 48 U.S. state capitals to prove its durability. The trip began in Washington, D.C., on August 28, 1916, and ended four months later on January 7, 1917, after covering a staggering 18,430 miles.
