

## Oldsmobile 98 – 1958 Coupe

Positioned within the General Motors family just below Cadillac and Buick—but above Chevrolet and Pontiac—the Oldsmobile 98 came loaded with ambition. This model boasts the legendary Rocket V8 engine: 6.1 liters of displacement and 277 horsepower, all controlled through a 4-speed automatic transmission.

Fun fact: this exact model is often cited as the most chrome-decorated car in American history. Just look at it shine!
