

## Chevrolet FB 40 1921

This vehicle comes from the state of Connecticut, from the town of Enfield. Its previous owner, Joe, is retired and has promised to come and visit us someday.

The car is in beautiful condition, thanks entirely to its owner, who cared for it for more than 44 years.

Chevrolet produced this model between 1919 and 1922. In 1922, the traditional wooden-spoke wheels were replaced by steel disc wheels, which were considered highly progressive for their time. In 1923, the model was succeeded by the new **Chevrolet Superior**.

Chevrolet was founded in 1911 by **Louis Chevrolet** and **William C. Durant**. In 1915, however, a disagreement arose between the two men, and Louis Chevrolet sold his share of the company to Durant.

A year later, William Durant merged the **Chevrolet Motor Car Company** into the growing **General Motors** corporation.

Since 2004, Chevrolet badges have also appeared on vehicles originally produced by **Daewoo**. In South America, Chevrolet branding has likewise been used on models sold in Europe under the **Opel** name, including the **Corsa, Astra, and Vectra**.
